From the Heart of the Director

Joe arrived at Journey Home the morning of the coronavirus being declared to be in Monroe County. My phone started ringing at 630 a.m. Joe was welcomed and lovingly cared for for the next 7 days. We were all walking

on eggshells for the week. Everything was so uncertain. Yet caring for Joe was so easy.

Being the special place that Journey Home is, I was not surprised when all of the volunteers and staff came in each day to care for Joe and his family. The hardest part was having to limit visitors and not being able to hug. The volunteers diligently cleaned the house with disinfectant wipes so much that our supply of sanitizer, gloves and soaps began to diminish. It paid off as all of us were kept healthy.

Conversations were heightened as we tried to foresee the future and how we would deal with our precious home. So much was at stake with protecting our volunteers and their families. The decision to pause our care came to us the day Joe died on March 18th.

The hardest thing I have done in my 20 years of ministry was closing the doors of Journey Home for an undetermined amount of time. It was suggested we keep the house closed for a week before cleaning. Our dear Mary and her son, Justin, deep cleaned the house, made the beds with fresh sheets and made sure everything was ready to welcome our next resident. It feels so long since life was shared in our home.

How often do we wish to have just one extra day to "hang around" in our own homes? Wanting to spring clean, do necessary chores, garden, nap or watch movies? Who knew we would be doing this for months, vs. days? Who knew it would be so hard to do "just that!"

We are all weathering the storm for the most part, with social distancing, wearing of masks, Instacarting, etc. There has been much drama, many fears but also many treasured moments. Think of the wealth of kindness we have seen; the pouring out of care for one another; the creativity of celebrations; doing things we have forgotten to do. How vanity is not an issue—we all look overgrown and silly in our masks! Nonetheless, Spring has still sprung, Easter dawned and although out hearts are torn apart, our souls remain intact.

We were honored to have welcomed her to Journey Home; she shared with us her final days. A humbling and difficult journey when it is one of our own. Mary Jo is and always will be, one of our many treasures and will be dearly missed by all.

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Opportunities to Continue Supporting Jour
