As of our reopening after COVID, we have lost the financial and aide support that the hospice agencies had given us for 21 of our 23 years. Volunteer Corner

As we find ourselves in the Spring of 2023, I wanted to update you on the various committees that work so hard to help around Journey Home. It would be wonderful to strengthen the core number of people who help with all these endeavors. **If you are interested in joining any of these opportunities, please leave a message for me at 225-1240 or send me an e-mail at journeyhome994@gmail.com.**

- ◆ Phone Calls: Once a week calls are made to Resident Care Volunteers to fill empty weekend slots. Volunteers work once every 5 or 6 weeks depending on the number of committee members.
- ◆ Cleaning: The common areas of the house are cleaned once a week. Volunteers work once every 4 or 5 weeks depending on the number of committee members.
- ◆ Baking: This committee currently has about 12 members. They take turns supplying “sweet treats” for us and stews/soups for the freezer at Journey Home. This is very helpful when our residents are still able to enjoy food. Again, the Committee Chair sets up a rotation suitable for each volunteer.
- ◆ Fundraising: We need people who have ideas, contacts, and/or time. We meet monthly to plan and build our options. We need your ideas and participation. Help us put the “fun” in fundraising.
- ◆ Gardening: The Day of Caring will take place in early May. Once that clean-up is completed, we will need to take care of our gardens. Are you able to help with these tasks? This committee doesn't currently have many participants and we definitely could use your help!
- ◆ Maintenance: If you are handy with repairs/maintenance, please consider helping us at Journey Home. Some jobs are routine (ex. twice a year) some more “on demand.” Your expertise would be put to good use.
- ◆ Thank You Note Writers: Stationary, addresses, and stamps are provided. We need your help to write notes thanking people for donations, etc. The sentiment for the notes is provided too.

Thank you for ALL you already do for Journey Home. Please consider one of the committees listed above to help make the work go even smoother. “Many hands make like work.”
